contribute or make a difference in a troubled world however small; curiosity and search for peace, both inner and outer; these threads brought me to meeting'.

'I come to Meeting to deepen my spiritual life and to be part of a loving community. Over the last twenty years the honesty, simplicity, equality and peace seeking has come to mean more and more to me.'

We seek to be a friendly and open spiritual community, which accepts everyone.



'I come to Meeting for Worship to experience God directly in a community. For me, this is the great relevance of our Society today.'


'The refreshing peace and thought-provoking words spoken in love give me a firm foundation for everything I do. I also relish the friendship and the laughter.'

'I come to Meeting because it is a very special thing - and quite a new thing - for me. It is a time where we can come together to seek what is profound and blessed in our world. A time of Silence that is full of meaning, of true communion, a time where if you listen long enough the full potential of life, and how to live it well, can reveal itself.'

'I came to Meeting in search of spiritual truth without dogma and most importantly, without fear or threat - as a human being, not a "sinner seeking salvation". From Meeting for Worship I get the opportunity to be gathered together, to be part of silent or spoken ministry, and moved together spiritually rather than led by an individual's sermon.'

'I come to Quakers because worshipping together is central to my life. Through our shared worship I connect with that of God within me and within others.
